A specific example of how the Columbia Foundation helps to multiply the impact of the funds entrusted to it, consider Rev. Mathangani's ministry in developing Christian leaders in Africa.

Samson Mathangani was a member of Columbia Baptist Church who felt the Lord's call to the ministry. He attended seminary in Birmingham, Alabama, with support from the Columbia Foundation and other organizations in the church. Following graduation, he returned to Africa to pursue a vision to train African pastors who often have little or no access to seminaries and limited resources for further Christian training and development.

He established the *Institute for Quality Christian Leadership* and enlisted a cadre of educators who travel to Nyeri, Kenya, to conduct intensive two-week seminars for pastors and church leaders, many using scholarships provided by the Columbia Foundation.

The **Columbia Foundation** was established July 12, 1976, as a non-profit, tax-exempt Virginia Corporation. It assists people in need from all walks of life and all social and ethnic groups by providing grants and loans to help finance:

- Food and clothing expenses;
- Medical, social, and housing needs;
- Day care payments;
- Tuition for professional training, college, seminary, and the Columbia Institute of Fine Arts; and
- Christian ministries and outreach.

The Foundation's impact is felt **nationwide** through its financial assistance during emergency disasters such as hurricane Katrina or other unexpected catastrophes, and through its support for those attending institutes of higher education across the country.

The Foundation's impact is felt **internationally** through support for mission activities such as a decade-old summer ministry to a Russian orphanage in Demidov, Russia, a multi-year medical ministry to Honduras, and purchasing Bibles for churches in Haiti.
